# What We Do



We love introducing First Tee kids to the game of golf! But what we love more is using the game to teach lifeenhancing skills and core values that will help shape futures...

Operating since 2006, First Tee of Greater Cincinnati & Northern Kentucky is one of over 150 chapters of First Tee nationwide. We offer innovative and proven youth development programming that integrates life skills, core values and healthy habits lessons with golf instruction. Our chapter serves children from 5 to 18 years old residing in Hamilton and Clermont counties in Ohio, and Boone, Campbell and Kenton counties in Kentucky.



Our Mission is to impact the lives of young people by providing educational programs that build character, instill lifeenhancing values and promote healthy choices through the game of golf.



# Programs

We reach children in our community through three main efforts- on the golf course, in schools, and through various youth centers and outreach partners. In total, we grew from 7,052 children impacted in 2018 to 11,864 in 2019! That tremendous amount of growth was fueled through nearly 3,000 volunteer hours via 170+ volunteers. In order to continue this growth trajectory, we look forward to more volunteers and coaches joining our team!



#### On the Golf Course

In 2019, 718 children participated in First Tee Life Skills Experience (LSE) classes delivered in multi-week spring, summer and fall sessions at six area golf course teaching locations. This number increased from the 547 who

participated in 2018. LSE is our core program offering, where kids begin at an introductory level and advance through five levels as they age and hone both their golf skills and their understanding of character education components.

#### In Schools

In elementary schools in our community and across the United States, many students are teeing off for the first time thanks to First Tee National School Program (NSP), bringing our curriculum to your child's gym during physical education class. By teaching elementary students First Tee's Nine Core Values and Nine Healthy Habits, we're putting them on the course to a healthy and active lifestyle. This year



we added 19 new schools, bringing our total to 38 elementary schools who are delivering First Tee curriculum in their PE classes. A large part of this growth was the addition of the Kenton County School District in Kentucky thanks to a generous grant from the Charles H. Dater Foundation. In total, we reached 10,777 kids in schools!

# **Community Collaborations**

Our chapter embraces opportunities to actively collaborate with a growing number of organizations in the community. Traditionally, this is accomplished through the First Tee DRIVE program, meeting youth where they spend time. Below are brief snapshots of some new and continued partnership initiatives from 2019.

SCRATCHgolf, a camp for children with congenital heart defects, is made possible by Children's Heart Association of Cincinnati in partnership with Cincinnati Children's Heart Institute was held for the third year this past August. To date, over 60 children have participated in the camp and/or Life Skills Experience program with our chapter. In 2019 we added an afternoon session for returning campers.

For centers that were delivering our DRIVE program, we launched two field "takeovers" at Mt. Washington and Winton Hills through our continued partnership with the Cincinnati Recreation Commission. We also welcomed children from OTR and Millvale to our golf courses this past summer for a 6-week camp.

For the first time, we led an eight-week program in partnership with Special Olympics of Hamilton County and we can't wait for next year!

We partnered with Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Cincinnati for our first-ever

for close to 20 area kids on the autism spectrum. Because of the success of this program and partnership, it left us wanting to do more with these kids! Thanks to generous grants from the USGA and the Cincinnati Rotary, we were able to complete training in November to become an Els for Autism #GameON program site! There are over 150 chapters in the First Tee network and we will be one of 17 chapters offering multi-week programming for children with Autism in 2020!







# The PLAYer Experience

Our second annual PLAYer Experience celebration and kick off to Campaign for Kids was incredible! We were able to recognize and celebrate our PLAYers for their achievements this year and inspire everyone with our PLAYer's stories. We heard from coaches, alumni and current PLAYers. They shared why First Tee GCNKY is important to them and what golf has done in their lives. There were 151 PLAYers that certified to the next level over the past year.

At the event, five deserving seniors (Elizabeth, Zachary, Abigail, Ethan and Suraj) were recognized and awarded a total of \$15,000 in scholarships!! Taylor Metcalfe, a current trustee, presented the Rita S. Metcalfe Scholarship for First Tee GCNKY to these seniors for a total of \$10,000. WOW! Thank you, Taylor, for your generosity! In addition, we were blessed to receive a grant from the Wadsworth Golf Charities Foundation to support this event and our golf course programming which allowed us to give an additional \$1,000 to each of these seniors.

The Tom and Melissa Briner Heart of First Tee GCNKY Award was established this year to recognize individuals, companies, parents, coaches, volunteers, or staff who embody the "Heart" of the First Tee through giving of time, talent or treasure; by demonstrating and living First Tee Core Values; or by going above and beyond to promote or further our missions.

There are many words and contexts that describe a heart. People are the heartbeat of an organization. Those with big hearts are generous; they care, nurture, encourage, and inspire. Said more simply, they love. Those who embrace these qualities live out the essence of the mission every day. It was our honor to present this award to Tom and Melissa Briner. Tom, with endless support from Melissa, started our First Tee Chapter in 2006 and have touched many lives throughout the years and continues to coach and mentor kids in our community.

# National Opportunities



- Victor- sophomore, Ace


They persevered through less than ideal conditions with cold temperatures on Friday and steady rain on Saturday but represented our chapter well. Victor finished second overall with a 78-74!

## **Financial Analysis**

In 2019, we continued efforts to strengthen our financial position to ensure the quality and growth of our programming operations. We are careful stewards of the support we receive, keeping a sharp eye on our expenses and seeking operating efficiencies wherever possible.

We were able to grow our reach of participants by 68% from 2018 to 2019. We managed to achieve this growth with only a 6.2% increase in our budget. We are grateful to individuals, grant funders, corporate partners, and other support that enables us to reach an increasing number of children in our community.

### **Clubhouse Society**

Launched in September, The Clubhouse Society enables individuals to mirror the commitment of our participants. Individuals contributing a minimum of \$2,006 annually are recognized as members of the Clubhouse Society. The \$2,006 gift is in honor of the year our chapter was established and we encourage a five-year commitment to echo the five levels of progression a child makes through First Tee curriculum- PLAYer, Par, Birdie, Eagle, Ace.
